Make sure each paragraph has a topic sentence, three details, and a conclusion sentence. <br> - Reading: <br> - Fiction - Read a fiction story for at least 20 minutes (complete story OR several chapters). You can pick books from your home library, a classroom book, RAZ-Kids, or Epic!. Fill out a plot diagram using the elements of fiction from what you read. <br> - Non-fiction - Read a non-fiction story for at least 20 minutes (complete story OR several chapters). You can pick books from your home library, a classroom book, RAZ-Kids, or Epic!. Fill out a main idea and details graphic organizer using evidence from what you read. <br> - Comprehenion - Choose 3-4 books on RAZ-Kids. Listen, read, and take the quiz (make sure you pass it) for each book. <br> Fluency - Pick a book of your choice (from your home library, a classroom book, RAZ-Kids, or Epic!) and read for at least 30 minutes or three chapters. When you finish, pick a few pages to record as you time yourself reading for one minute. 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| Math | Choose at least 2 activities to complete totaling about 1 hour of work time. <br> 1. Shape scavenger hunt! On a piece of paper, write the following categories: two sets of parallel lines, at least one right angle, quadrilaterals that are not squares or rectangles, polygons that are not quadrilaterals. Find 3-5 shapes for every attribute and add them to the appropriate list by drawing a picture or take a picture with a camera. This should take about 20-30 minutes. <br> 2. Select a math website/app that you use at school or at home (examples: Prodigy, Freckle, Everyday Math, etc.). Review your math skills by playing on this website/app for 15-20 minutes. <br> 3. Make your own fact families. Draw six multiplication/division fact traingles using different numbers (no doubles, zeros, or 1s). Write all four number sentences that belong in that fact family below the triangle. This should take about 10-15 minutes. <br> 4. Skip counting. Skip count by 2 s from $20-80$. Skip count by 3 s from $0-33$. Skip count by 4 s from $0-$ 44. Skip count by 5 s from $100-200$. Skip count by 10 s from $32-232$. You can add in some fun movements as you skip count (examples: jumping jacks, squats, hops, air punches, etc.).
