English Language Arts	<p>Choose at least 1 activity from each category (writing, reading, spelling/grammar) totaling about 1 ½ hours of work time.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Writing: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Summary - Watch your favorite show (Netflix, cable, youtube, etc.) and write at least three paragraphs to summarize what happened. Make sure you include a topic sentence, three details, and a conclusion sentence for each paragraph. ○ Persuasive – Write a letter to your family persuading them to go outside with you and build a snowman. Write at least three paragraphs each having a topic sentence, three details, and a conclusion sentence. ○ Informational – Write at least one paragraph about how to solve the following math problem: Ann and her friend are walking home from school. Ann shows her friend this homework problem and her answer: The art club has \$100 to spend on materials. They bought watercolor paints for \$38 and brushes from \$19. How much money does the club have left over? Ann’s answer: \$67. Suppose that you are Ann’s friend and you do not have a pencil or a calculator with you. In your head, make an estimate for how much money the club has <u>left over</u>. Is Ann’s answer reasonable? Why or why not? ○ Narrative – Write a story about a snow day. Write at least three paragraphs each having a topic sentence, three details, and a conclusion sentence. ○ Free Write - Write at least three paragraphs on any topic you choose. Make sure each paragraph has a topic sentence, three details, and a conclusion sentence. • Reading: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Fiction – Read a fiction story for at least 20 minutes (complete story OR several chapters). You can pick books from your home library, a classroom book, or Epic!. Fill out a plot diagram using the elements of fiction from what you read. ○ Non-fiction - Read a non-fiction story for at least 20 minutes (complete story OR several chapters). You can pick books from your home library, a classroom book, or Epic!. Fill out a main idea and details graphic organizer using evidence from what you read. 	<p>1 hour, 30 minutes</p> <p>(if this takes longer, please stop the activity)</p>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Comprehension - Choose 3-4 books on Epic. Listen, read, and take the quiz (make sure you pass it) for each book. ○ Fluency – Pick a book of your choice (from your home library, a classroom book, or Epic!) and read for at least 30 minutes or three chapters. When you finish, pick a few pages to record as you time yourself reading for one minute. Submit your most fluent reading to your teacher through SeeSaw or email. ○ Literature Circles - Pick a book of your choice (from your home library, a classroom book, or Epic!) and read for at least 30 minutes. Choose 2-3 roles to complete. ○ Freckle ELA – answer questions on https://student.freckle.com ● Spelling OR Grammar: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Use your best cursive writing to write your spelling words 3 times each. ○ Complete your assigned spelling activity for today or practice on Spelling City. https://www.spellingcity.com ○ Grammar - Create a part of speech poster/collage, be sure to include definitions and examples within a text (nouns, verbs, adjectives, adverbs). 	
Math	<p>Choose at least 2 activities to complete totaling about 1 hour of work time.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. What is the area and perimeter of what you have to shovel on this snow day? Measure the driveway or sidewalk outside of your home using your foot as the standard unit of measurement. Calculate the area and the perimeter of the space you have to shovel. Draw a picture of this space and label the length of each side. Write the number models you used to calculate the perimeter and area. This should take about 15 – 20 minutes. 2. Review previously taught math skills. Log into the Everyday Math website: https://connected.mcgraw-hill.com/connected/pictorialLoginSchool.do?code=p7i3 and select 1-2 games to play. This should take about 15-20 minutes. Or Freckle Math– answer questions on https://student.freckle.com 3. Make your own math problems. Write five addition problems using 3 or 4 digit numbers. Write five subtraction problems using 3 or 4 digit numbers. Solve all of the problems you created.; make sure you show all of your work. Challenge: Show multiple different ways to solve each of the problems (examples: fact extensions, parts-and-total diagrams, comparison diagrams, change diagrams, partial sums, expanded form, column addition, etc.) This should take about 30-50 minutes. 4. Go outside and draw 4 rectangles in the snow. Divide each rectangle into equal groups to make the following fractions: halves, fourths, sixths, eighths. Now scoop out the snow in each rectangle to make equivalent fractions equalling $\frac{1}{2}$. After you come inside, draw the four equivalent fractions on a piece of paper and label them. This should take about 15-20 minutes. 	<p>1 hour (if this takes longer, please stop the activity)</p>
