English Language Arts	<p>Please complete the number of activities that fulfill the estimated duration noted on the right.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Use your "tapping fingers" to tap out the sounds of five different items in your home.● Find three items that begin with the letter D. Draw pictures of the items, and label your pictures with words using kidwriting.● Go to www.starfall.com. Practice the letters and sounds.● Get out letter cards. If you do not have letter cards, write the alphabet on a piece of paper. Then, say the sound for each letter.● Use letter cards to build ten CVC (consonant-vowel consonant) words (examples: dog, pen, rat, sit).● Get out your sight word list. Read as many words as you know to an adult.● Kidwrite about something that you like to do with your friends. Illustrate your story.● Select a story to read with an adult. Look at the cover, and make a prediction about what will happen in the story. Read the story with an adult. After you read, ask and answer the following questions: Who were the characters? What was your favorite part of the story?● Write all capital letters. Then, write all lowercase letters. Remember to use proper letter formation.● Go to Literacy Center Education Network at http://tinyurl.com/j3co3l3 to practice letter formation.● Practice forming the letters of the alphabet using items found around your home (examples: spoons, Legos, play-doh, rulers, spaghetti, sticks).	45-60 minutes

What day of the week is it today? What day was it yesterday? What day will it be tomorrow? What is the weather today?● Practice writing your numbers through thirty using correct number formation.	45 minutes

Practice skip counting to 100 by tens. ● Go to Literacy Center Education Network at http://tinyurl.com/glg32tu to work with numbers. ● Take a stuffed animal and practice placing it – beside, over, on, next to, under, on top of, in front of, behind, between – another object. ● Practice forming shapes using items found in your home (examples: spoons, Legos, rulers, spaghetti, sticks, etc.) ● Find two of the following shapes in your house: circle, square, rhombus, rectangle, oval, triangle. ● Practice shape identification at http://tinyurl.com/24anst6. ● Practicing counting out ten objects using one-to-one correspondence. Then, make a set of twenty. ● Dance and sing to the following songs: http://tinyurl.com/njuvyjt (count by tens to 100) and http://tinyurl.com/prudlyk (count to 100 by ones).
